REQUIREMENTS •

To register to vote, you must be:

- a U.S. citizen,
- 18 years of age or older by Election Day,
- a resident of Boston at the time of registration (there are no length-of-residency requirements).

VOTER REGISTRATION •

You may register at the Election Department, Boston City Hall, during regular work hours. There are evening and weekend registration sessions at City Hall and in neighborhoods just prior to registration deadlines. (For dates and times call the Election Department.) You may register at some other city's Election Department or Town Clerk's office anywhere within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. You may register at the Registry of Motor Vehicles or at any one of several state agencies, including AFDC and Food Stamps, WIC, Medicaid, Commission for the Blind, Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing. Students can often register at school. You may register by mail on a Massachusetts official Mail-In Voter Registration Form, available from the Election Department. This form must be postmarked by the registration deadline.

REGISTRATION PERIODS •

Registration is cut off 20 days before city and special elections and 20 days before national and state elections to allow the Election Department to prepare the voting lists. Registration never closes. After the cut-off date, a person may register for subsequent elections.

ANNUAL RESIDENT LISTING •

The annual listing of residents 17 years and older (city census) is conducted each year under the auspices of the Boston Election Department. The first step is a mailing to all households in the city, followed up by a house-to-house enumeration. Large multi-residential dwellings (dormitories, housing developments, nursing homes, convents, etc.) are usually enumerated through management offices.

VOTING LISTS •

If a resident is missed on the annual listing of Boston residents, notification will be sent to her/his address on the voting list. This notification must be returned to the Election Department prior to the election in order to maintain the registration. If you change your name or have moved from another city/town, it is necessary to re-register. If you are registered and move from one address to another within the city, notify the Election Department by mail. Whenever you move, *it is always best to check with the Election Department before an election to make sure that you are on the correct voting list.*

2011 REGISTRATION CUT-OFF DATES •

To be eligible to vote in the September 27 Preliminary Election, you must register by September 7. To be eligible for the November 8 Final Election, you must register by October 19.

POLLING PLACES* •

There is one polling place for each precinct. You must vote in the precinct where you are registered. In Boston, polling places are open from 7:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M.

VOTING MACHINES •

Voting in all elections in Boston is by machine.

ABSENTEE VOTING •

Absentee voting is permitted in all elections. If you are registered, you may vote by absentee ballot if you

- will be absent from the city on Election Day
- have a physical disability
- cannot vote at the polls due to religious beliefs

To obtain an Absentee Ballot, you must apply in writing to the Boston Election Commission (City Hall, Boston, MA 02201). Be sure to include the following information in your application:

- your name
- your address
- your ward and precinct if you know them
- your signature
- for a Primary, the party whose ballot you wish

Your application must be received by noon of the day before the election. However, it is wise to allow sufficient time for the mails; a completed ballot must be returned by mail or in person by you or a family member and must be received by the time polls close on Election Day. Once ballots are prepared (about three weeks before the election), you may vote in person at City Hall if you will be unable to go to the polls on Election Day. Cut-off time for voting in person is noon of the day preceding the election. Certain unregistered voters may also vote absentee: residents of Massachusetts outside the state; federal service personnel including those on active duty in the armed forces and merchant marine and their accompanying spouses and dependents; and prisoners. Application for an absentee ballot may be made in writing by the applicant, or a close relative may apply at the Election Department on behalf of the absent person.

CITY ELECTIONS •

All city elections are non-partisan; the voter does not declare a party.

HOW CAN I VOTE IN A PRIMARY? •

If you state a political party preference when you register, you will be given the ballot of that party. If you are not enrolled in a party, you may still vote in a Primary. You ask for the party ballot you prefer.

MAY I CHANGE PARTY IDENTIFICATION? •

You may change your party enrollment in person or by mail at any time, except during the 20 days before the Primary Elections.
